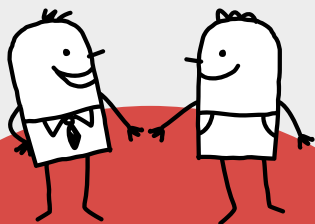

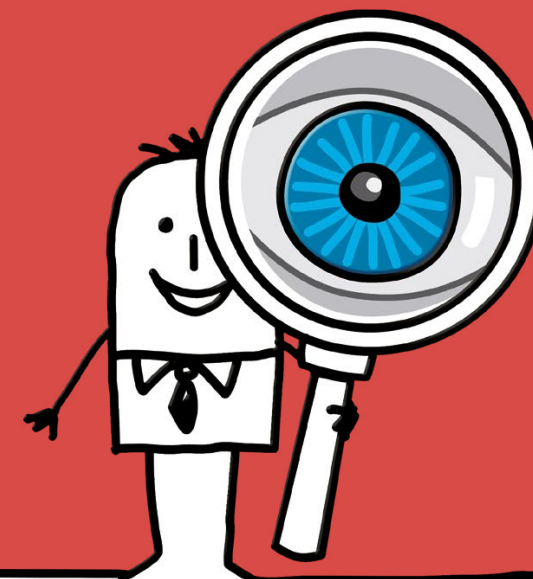
Guided walking tours through Marzahn-Hellersdorf

Guided walking tours through Marzahn-Hellersdorf

All tours start at 14:00 in front of the main entrance of ASH Berlin and end at 16:00 with a communal barbecue at the urban garden "Helle Oase" (Team Helle Oase: Anna Juhnke).

TOUR 1

The Educational Landscape of Hellersdorf

With: Eva Hertzsch & Adam Page (Station urbaner Kulturen/nGbK Hellersdorf and ASH Berlin, Campus Transferale – Pilot Project Zwischenräume), Katrin Velten (ASH Berlin, Campus Transferale – Pilot Project Zwischenräume)

Built in the late 1980s, demolished in the late 2000s, and rebuilt in the early 2020s – the changing significance of school buildings in Hellersdorf demonstrates just how rapid and radical transformations in large housing estates can be. The tour, led by visual artists Eva Hertzsch and Adam Page, will start at the "Classroom of the Future" pavilion in front of ASH Berlin, where members of the local residents' council will introduce their raised beds as an educational space. The tour will continue to a school demolition site, where a new school is planned to be built, and then to a newly constructed school as part of the Berlin School Construction Initiative. Two school gardens will also be visited. Along the way, artistic visions from residents, ASH members, artists, and students for the future of education in Hellersdorf will be presented.

TOUR 2

Green Learning Spaces – Environmental Education in Marzahn-Hellersdorf

Numerous institutions and projects in Marzahn-Hellersdorf offer a wide range of educational activities focused on nature, environment, climate, and sustainability. These initiatives help raise awareness of urban nature and environmental protection. We invite you to a walk through Kienberg Park. First, staff from the Kienberg Park Environmental Education Centre will give us an insight into their work with different age groups. Afterwards, we will experience the impressive urban nature of the district and highlight the engagement of many volunteers. Marzahn-Hellersdorf is a green and vibrant district.

Please note: Part of the tour involves travelling by underground (U-Bahn), so make sure to bring a valid ticket.

TOUR 3

Far Away Yet So Close – Discovering Green Hellersdorf

This tour introduces some green spaces close to Alice Salomon University. The route passes through new housing developments and the Hellersdorfer Promenade towards the Hönower Weiherkette nature reserve, a recreational and learning space featuring woodlands, water, wildlife, and plant life. Here, we will see the effects of climate change in real life and explore what can be done about it, what measures are planned, and how citizens can get involved in planning processes. We will also take a look at the current state of implementation. As an example of civic engagement, this tour will also honour recently deceased local environmental activists

TOUR 4

Hellersdorfer Promenade and Beyond – A Changing Neighbourhood

Since 2005, when the Neighbourhood Management (QM) Team started its work, the area around Alice Salomon University has undergone continuous change. Some transformations have been driven by ideas and suggestions from residents and local institutions, while others result from borough-wide and city-wide policies and developments. This tour will highlight specific examples around Kastanienallee and Hellersdorfer Promenade, showing what has changed and discussing its impact on the local community.

TOUR 5

Engaged in Hellersdorf – Experiencing Student Volunteering

This tour presents two institutions that showcase different facets of social engagement. It will focus on sociocultural participation in the local community, offering opportunities to explore, contribute, and shape social life

in the area. During the tour, you will learn about where and how to get involved, whether through structured or spontaneous volunteering. You are also encouraged to develop your own project ideas.

TOUR 6

The Community Garden at the Old Hellersdorf Estate

Urban gardening is more than just an individual search for a beautifully designed retreat in the city. TOUR 7

Youth Spaces, Sports, and Recreational Facilities

What's happening in Marzahn-Hellersdorf? The district offers numerous youth centres with a wide range of programmes and activities for children and young people. These spaces provide opportunities to connect with local communities and participate in various social and recreational activities. Join us for a walk through Hellersdorf-North, where we will explore these opportunities and finish at the Streetball court on the rooftop of the Eastend Youth Centre. Afterwards, we will head to Helle Oase for a final barbecue.
